GTA'ers showed up to discuss the organization of chess in the GTA. 4 Executive Members were present: David Cohen (President); Caesar Posylek (Vice-President); Bryan Lamb (Treasurer); Mark Dutton (Communications Director). 6 Board members were also present representing their chess clubs: Nicholas Varmazis (Willowdale CC); Jim Ferrier (Brampton CC); Maurice Smith (Rouge Valley CC); Ari Mendrinos (Oriole CC); Michael Barron (Antibes CC), and Martin Jaeger. There was one non-board member in attendance: Barry Thorvardson (from Brampton CC).

Each of the Executive members gave a report on the past year. What became clear was that volunteers among the Toronto chess community are drying up when it comes to the GTCL. The position of secretary remained unfilled all last year. There are so few volunteers that the same people end up in executive positions in other organizations , as well as the GTCL (eg. The Ontario Chess Association). There are few volunteers coming forward to put in bids on traditional GTCL – sponsored weekend tournaments. David Cohen will be directing the Toronto Blitz Championship, and the Toronto Game/15 Championship. The Labour Day weekend tournament this year was again awarded to Randy Moysoski / Macedonian Chess Club. Martin Jaeger was given the right to hold the Toronto Senior Championship and the Toronto Senior Active Championship through to 2005. There were no bids for other tournaments.

Thanks was given to David Gebhardt for the successful running of the GTCL Chess Team League this year, won by Dutton Chess Club.

A new executive was elected for 2003, but here again the malaise in terms of Toronto chess showed through. Both the positions of President and Vice-president could not be filled, and were left vacant, with hopes that volunteers would come forward later. Bryan Lamb was elected Secretary, and Nicholas Vermazis became Treasurer. The 3 Directors-at-Large were: Martin Jaeger, Ari Mendrinos, and Barry Thorvardson.
