#### **FIDE July 1 Rating List**

There is still only one player over 2800: #1: Garry Kasparov (Russia), 13<sup>th</sup> FIDE World Champion – 2812. Although he is now retired, he will be shown on the active rating list for one year after his last game, and then be removed for inactivity.

There are now18 players in the 2700's. Viswanathan Anand (India), 2000 FIDE World Champion, is in second with a rating of 2788; tied with Anand, and in the # 3 spot, is Veselin Topalov (Bulgaria), also rated 2788; Peter Leko (Hungary), the challenger to Kramnik in the 2004 World Championship match, is in the # 4 spot with 2763; Vassily Ivanchuk (Ukraine) has now moved ahead of Kramnik, and holds the # 5 spot, with 2752; Vladimir Kramnik (Russia), current Classical World Champion, has now fallen to # 6 and has 2744 (drop of 9 pts. since the April list); Judit Polgar (Hungary), the strongest women's player in the world, with 2735, is in the # 8 spot. Entering the top 10 for the first time is Levon Aronian (Armenia), # 10, with 2744.

At # 17 (up from # 20) is Ruslan Ponomariov (Ukraine), 2002 FIDE World Champion, at 2704 (up 9 pts.);  $12^{th}$  FIDE World Champion, Anatoly Karpov (Russia) is # 33 (down from # 27) – 2672; 2004 FIDE World Champion, Rustan Kasimdzhanov (Uzbekistan) is # 35 at 2670; 1999 FIDE World Champion, Alexander Khalifman (Russia) is # 49 – 2653;

Here are a number of the younger players we're watching: Etienne Bacrot (France) is #9 – 2729; Alexander Grischuk (Russia) is #12–2720; Teimour Radjabov (Azerbaijan) is #23 (up from #29) – 2682; Francisco Vallejo Pons (Spain) is #24 (up from #28) – 2681;.

#### 2. History of Chess in Canada

Chess players have been in Canada at least as far back as the 17th century, when Alexandre de Chaumont, aide-de-camp of de Tracy (Lt.-Gen. of the armies of the King of France in America), and one of the best chess players in France in 1665, spent two years in the French colony (now Quebec). Organized chess in Canada goes back to at least 1787, when Richard Bulkeley, a high-ranking civil servant, was president of a 'chess, pencil, and brush club' in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

#### 3. Popularity of Chess in Canada

The last survey taken on the popularity of chess in Canada showed that over 10% of the population plays at least one game of chess per year. This ranks chess behind only swimming as the most popular recreational/sporting activity in Canada. (Other sports, such as hockey, are more watched, but are less participated in.) Chess has become even more popular recently, as more schools adopt chess either in their curriculum, or as a lunch-time or after-school activity.
